

About ACT for Alexandria

- ACT for Alexandria is a community foundation that improves the lives of Alexandrians by turning ideas into action and resources into results.
- ACT helps donors achieve their philanthropic goals, supports nonprofit organizations in achieving their missions and mobilizes the community around important issues.



Overview

The City of Alexandria has designated \$4M of the American Rescue Plan Act funds to develop and implement the Alexandria Community Access and Emergency Support Grant Program.

This initiative funding includes:

- Service navigation support to ensure that individuals and families are accessing all ARPA, federal, state and local programs for which they are eligible
- Tangible financial aid direct emergency/safety net support to residents

This program is being supported by the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds award number 21.027 awarded by the City of Alexandria, Virginia by the U.S. Department of the Treasury.

DCHS Support

 Two FTE Service Navigators will be available to serve as internal department navigation liaisons to ensure that the connection of eligible residents to public programs within the department.

DCHS service navigators will be responsible for:

- Working with selected Community Access Service Navigators to link Alexandria residents to programs and services
- Trouble-shooting challenges and barriers to services
- Routinely identifying systems, issues, and bottlenecks that impact effective service connection and delivery

Community Access

- Service navigators play a crucial role in increasing awareness and spreading knowledge about available resources. Recognizing the importance that navigators play in building strong and trusted relationships within the community, this program is meant to support new and existing navigation models.
- The Community Access program will help to provide navigation support to ensure individuals are enrolled in key local, state, and federal programs that they are eligible for. This program will be offered as a one-time funding opportunity offered over a 20-month period – April 2022 – December 2023.

Emergency Support

- Recognizing the urgent needs of community members, emergency assistance is often needed to supplement state benefits or assist those who do not meet qualifications for certain government programs
- The Emergency Support program will provide tangible and emergency financial aid that includes but is not limited to gift cards, transportation assistance, childcare, eviction prevention, and financial assistance. This program will be offered in six-month grant periods, beginning with April 2022 – October 2022

Learning & Evaluation

Goal: Community members are connected to the resources and supports they need to thrive, in a timely and respectful way.

- Increased access to and acquisition of public benefits
- Dignity and respect of constituents accessing services
- Increased understanding of what enhances people's ability to access services
- Enhanced stability through enrollment in public benefits and tangible aid to avoid crisis
- Strengthened partnerships with the community and in the Alexandria social services sector
- Improved understanding of recommendations through systems reform


- Create an account on Foundant, ACT's Grant Management System




Organization Information

Dashboard

Log on to see your Dashboard. You will be able to access any open grant applications, view your organization's follow-up forms, and complete any required reporting. To apply for the grant, click the "Apply" button in the top navigation bar and select the applicable grant application process.



Application Questions and Attestation

 Grantees will be required to answer application questions that explain how funding will provide relief to Alexandrians impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic

Example: Briefly describe how the community access funds will be used for service navigation, the number of Alexandrians you anticipate serving, the population you intend on serving, and a proposed timeline for the use of the funds.

Attestation

Examples: Grantee shall keep adequate records to substantiate its expenditures of grant funds and retain those records for five years.

I acknowledge that I cannot charge more than 10% of the grant award for administrative costs, such as salaries, wages, benefits, and supplies related to the project unless my organization has a federally negotiated indirect cost rate.

Fiscal Reporting and Trainings

- Grantees will be required to report how the funding is being used
- Grantees must attend all City sponsored meetings and training sessions deemed beneficial to the administration and performance and services funded by this Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds ("SLFRF") funded program. This includes, but is not limited to, the City's fraud prevention and IT security programs.
- The Fraud prevention and IT security programs must be taken by the Grantee's project manager and fiscal officer responsible for management of the funds prior to disbursement of funds

Community Access Reporting

Community access grantees will be asked to track data related to navigation using provided templates and tools, and report aggregate data at regular intervals.

Data may include:

- **Constituent Demographics**
 - Type of applicant (i.e., individual, family, older adult, etc.)
 - Zip code
 - Race/ethnicity

- Navigation contact or impact (# people and # times met with a navigator)
- Method of navigation (phone, in person, text, online)
- Barriers to service entry and/or enrollment
- Types of service(s) needed
- Referral source(s)
- Navigation outcome(s)

Emergency Support Reporting

Emergency support grantees will be asked to track data related to crisis avoidance, provided templates and tools, and report aggregate data at regular intervals. Data may include:

- Constituent Demographics
 - Type of applicant (i.e., individual, family, older adult, etc.)
 - Zip code
 - Race/ethnicity
- Contact/Impact (# people and # times met with organization)

- Method of service delivery (phone, in person, text, online)
- Barriers to service entry and/or enrollment
- Types of service(s) needed
- Referral source(s)
- \$ amount of financial assistance
- Type of assistance provided
