#### About the Alexandria Resilience Fund (ARF)

- Established in 2019 as the ACT Now Fund supporting Alexandrians affected by the Federal Government Shutdown
- Awarded \$1.25M in COVID relief funds from 2020 2022
- Alexandria Resilience Fund Racial Equity Statement highlighted the importance of funding organizations that:
  - Support communities most impacted by the pandemic
  - Demonstrate deep, trusted relationships with community members
  - Center racial equity internally and externally
  - Invest in solutions that address the root causes of poverty and promote economic mobility for Alexandrians



#### **Alexandria Resilience Fund Grant Overview**

- Capacity Building Grant Request Priorities:
  - Community engagement
  - Fund development planning
  - Racial equity
  - Strategic planning
- Grant Pool: \$125,000, inviting requests up to \$20,000
- Anticipate 6 or 7 awards
- Timeframe: January December 2024

#### **Alexandria Resilience Fund Grant Checklist**

My organization...

□ Serves the geographic area of Alexandria – City of and Fairfax County Alexandria (if the organization serves the broader region or isn't solely focused on Alexandria, the capacity building request must clearly demonstrate how the grant will strengthen operations and programs and services for Alexandrians)

- □ Serves Alexandria communities disproportionately impacted by the pandemic
- □ Is actively addressing racial equity externally and internally within the organization
- □ Can demonstrate deep, trusted relationships with historically marginalized communities
- □ Will use funding solely for a strategic planning, fund development planning, community engagement, or racial equity capacity building project
- $\hfill\square$  Is a 501c3 or fiscally sponsored by a 501c3 organization
- □ Will expend grant funds during the period of January December 2024
- □ Agrees to share the impact and learnings from the capacity building grant by February 2025 in the form of a written report, conversation, or video format, as selected by the nonprofit
- Will participate in one grantee convening in 2024 and one in 2025 to encourage nonprofit learning and connection

- LOI application opens/information session September 26
- Office Hours September 29 10-11am, October 4 4-5pm and October 12 – 11-noon
- LOI Application deadline October 17 at 11:59pm late applications will not be accepted
- Grant Review Committee meets Mid-November
- Notification of next round advancement November 17
- Applicant conversations December 6 12
- Grant award notifications December 18

#### **Resilience Workshops with Heather Jelks**

- Effective Teaming November 16, 9am 1pm
  - Practical skills to build team culture based on trust, psychological safety, belonging and inclusion, leading to improved performance. Capacity – 20, cost \$65.
- Adaptive Resilience January 24, 31 & February 7, 10am noon
  - Build the behaviors, mental habits and practices that promote personal resilience while growing a resilient culture within your teams and organizations. Capacity – 20, cost is \$100 for series.
