
In 2004, ACT was formed in the spirit of community and collaboration. Our founders believed in the potential of what people could achieve when they work together. That idea has grown into a lasting community institution. After 20 years of connecting people, resources, and ideas, that spirit still inspires our work today and is what will propel us on the road ahead. Today, we share Alexandria's present and our future vision for a community where everyone belongs and can thrive. We invite you to invest in ACT and partner with us in making this vision a reality.

Implementing a Strategic Vision for ACT and Our City

ACT's theory of change: if we center community voice AND mobilize partners to invest in people struggling against inequities, we can create greater collective well-being in our community. The 2023 Impact Report outlines the process and results of our community-driven strategic plan, solidifying ACT's four pillars of support to the Alexandria Community: Support Giving, Support Nonprofit Success, Support Community Voice, and Support Economic Well-Being. Building upon our recent success and fueled with a strategic direction determined by the community, ACT is poised to work with our partners to make meaningful progress on entrenched issues and significantly address economic well-being by mobilizing holistic solutions.

Why This Plan is Needed for Alexandria

Alexandria is a racially, ethnically, and culturally diverse community of 160,000 residents with nearly 50% of Alexandrians identifying as BIPOC (black, indigenous, and other people of color). Public school students hail from 118 different countries and speak 120 different languages.



Equitable economic opportunity in our city is a pressing issue. Because of systemic racism, Black, Latino, and indigenous residents do not have the same opportunities to thrive and have worse outcomes for every economic, health, and educational indicator of well-being. The child poverty rate for Black children is 6x higher compared to White children. There are disparities in average income: \$62,000 for Latino and \$71,000 for Black households compared to \$131,000 for White households. Given the high cost of living, it is extremely difficult to make ends meet. An annual salary of \$77,000 is needed to afford to rent a one-bedroom apartment. As a result, our community is facing an eviction and affordable housing crisis. In addition, food insecurity is at pandemic levels. Alexandria's human service organizations are doing heroic work, yet they are under resourced and overwhelmed. Language and technology barriers, along with a fractured system create inefficiencies and prohibit access for families in need.

Many residents and our nonprofit partners have shared that low-income diverse Alexandrians do not feel a sense of belonging because they are underrepresented and living with the constant stress of poverty and discrimination. Systems are broken and there are barriers to the tools and resources they need to be healthy and move up the economic ladder.

Our community has the necessary ingredients to improve economic well-being for those who work and live in our city. ACT has engaged partners—a robust nonprofit ecosystem, local government, health care system, school system, business sector, faith community, outside funders, and residents—who are poised and ready to take-on these issues from a systems lens. These partners have turned to ACT based on trusted relationships we've spent years building, enabling them to be confident their engagement will be meaningful and effective, guided by learning, and centered on community.

What Will Your Investment Achieve for Alexandria?

ACT envisions a community where all residents feel a sense of belonging, have the tools and resources they need to thrive, and where the color of one's skin, ethnicity, or citizenship status does not determine outcomes in life. Your investment will be immediately deployed to accelerate ACT's work in four strategic impact areas centered on Giving, Nonprofit Success, Community Voice, and Economic Well-Being.

Already, we have seen the ripple effect as local and state organizations and governments have contacted ACT to speak to their communities on coalition building, systems change, and community-driven strategic planning.

The Opportunity

ACT is in an ideal position to take on Alexandria's biggest challenges. To do so we must have the capital to invest in bold solutions. Only then will we fully realize ACT's vision for a community where everyone thrives.



We are entering this campaign from a place of organizational strength. Over the past few years, ACT has expanded our donor base and doubled our operating budget. While ACT does not have an endowment and our operating budget must be raised year after year, we have been prudent in our financial practices.

Our history has shown that when we invest in our operations, the dividends are far-reaching. In 2019, ACT made a significant investment in our internal capacity and infrastructure. With that investment, we were well-positioned to respond nimbly and responsibly to the pandemic, ultimately shepherding \$5.76M in emergency support to Alexandria's nonprofits and the people they serve.

This is a big goal and will require unprecedented support. Therefore, we are proceeding with thoughtfulness, ambition, and determination.
